To refrain from (in this case, voting).

#### Appall

To shock or disgust.

#### Bigot

Someone who is intolerant of another's beliefs, opinions, race, ethnicity, or differing characteristic(s).

#### Burden of proof

The requirement to prove one's own case over another.

#### Coroner

One who examines a dead body.

## **Cross-examine**

To question a witness called to testify for the other side.

## Defendant

Someone who is charged with a crime and brought to trial.

## Defense

Those representing the defendant; lawyers for the defendant.

## Deliberate

To discuss the facts of a case and come to a conclusion or guilt or innocence.

## Dogged

Strong-willed, persistent.

## Elevated Train/ El train

An above-ground public transportation train system.

## Evidence

That which is used to prove a point or case (in a court of law).

## Homicide

The unlawful killing of another person; murder.

# Hung Jury

When a jury cannot come to a unanimous decision and the case must be retried in front of a new jury.

## Intimidate

To threaten, frighten or scare: to pressure someone into a decision or action.

## Jury

A group of people, most often twelve, chosen to judge a legal case and provide a verdict.

# Premeditated

Planned or thought out; intentional

## Prosecution

A lawyer or group of lawyers who presents those (the accuser) taking legal action against someone.

# Reasonable doubt

The idea that no other logical explanation can result from the provided evidence.

## Riffle

To look through.

#### Subservient

Obedient, submissive; giving into the wishes of others.

## Superficial

Shallow or phony; not sincere.

## Switchblade knife

A pocket knife with a blade contained in the handle. It opens automatically when a button, lever, or switch on the handle is activated.

#### Testimony

The evidence given by a witness which may be given in a written or oral manner.

## Trial

The public forum in which a case is tried before a judge and jury.

#### Unanimous
